## **Description of the Course :**

## This course consists of two key learning outcomes:

## **Technique:**

The technique strand completes the development of skills and techniques learnt in Dance 1 - 5. It is designed as a link to, and preparation for, potential work in the theatre industry. The dance styles taught will include: jazz/music theatre dance and tap. It will also explore dance techniques and the work of seminal artistic figures related to dance and movement as a form.

## Song and Dance:

The song and dance strand is geared towards the students devising their own song and dance number, and developing it to a level suitable for public performance. The students will be required to source sheet music for a particular song, source a backing track and choreograph the piece whilst paying homage to the original show style.

## **Course Content:**

This course incorporates techniques of various music theatre dance styles and movement forms. Technique classes will be geared towards application of techniques studied in Dance 1-5, in a studio audition practice setting. Choreography, collaborative creation and variety in style and form will feature in the Song and Dance strand of the course.
