Description of the Course:

This advanced Work Integrated Learning (WIL), skills based course is designed for students to work in collaboration and alongside an established artist to deliver a public, artistic outcome that may be a performance, an exhibition, a publication, or a community/festival-based multi-disciplinary project/event. In WIL collaboration with the lead professional artist, students will nominate a role for themselves, based on current skills and interests, and areas of applied practice and management. Students will be asked to draw on skills, knowledge and values in arts practice, cultural leadership and management in artistic and community contexts, that have been acquired and developed throughout the program; from conception through research and design, funding and organisational development, into delivery and acquittal of a public outcome.
