Description of the Course:

This course supports students in developing knowledge and skills in the conceptualisation, design and planning of a research project in an education-related topic. Students will consolidate their skills in searching and appraising relevant academic and/or grey literature in order to undertake an initial scope of the current knowledge regarding a contemporary Speech Pathology practice issue. They will then use these findings as a foundation on which to design and develop a research project and construct a research proposal.
