Description of the Course:

This is the first part (Part A) in a two part Masters Research course chain. Within this course chain students will work independently (with supervision) in completing a research project relevant to a contemporary speech pathology theory or practice issue in an Education discipline. In enacting their research plan in Part A, students will be required to demonstrate a solid understanding of their research methodology in a written research proposal, as well as strong organisational and planning skills. Students will consolidate their knowledge on their research topic area by designing, describing and presenting their project topic and research design and undertaking a critical analysis of the literature, culminating in the production of a literature review paper.

Students must participate in project supervision meetings - if a session is missed actions to catch up on discussions must be undertaken (S/U Grade).


Students must complete all assessment tasks and achieve a minimum overall grade of 50% to pass this course
