#### **Unit Content:**

Topics may include:

- Students will be introduced to series of fabricating techniques involving hand tools as well as the fundamental use of clay and glazes.
- Students will be led through a series of demonstrations and tutorials that relate to a series of set projects.
- Students will be given presentations that complement the relevant project.
- Detailed project sheets will be given to students on day 1 of class.
