Course Content:

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VASAP2003 VISUAL ART STUDIO PRACTICE 3

This course utilises prescriptive exercises in Printmaking and 3 dimensional art making. The course extends students' fine arts knowledge with the application of techniques, materials and processes of art-making in various media. Through workshop studio activities, students will focus on developing a personal aesthetic, and their appreciation and awareness of a range of multi- and two- dimensional artistic methodologies. Students will advance their professionalisation through a sharpening of their critical and evaluative skills. Students in this course will become conversant with, and confident in their approach to, challenging contemporary art theory and practice. Studio learning will be supported by visits to art galleries/artists studios, and exhibition spaces.
