Description of the Unit:

The purpose of this post-graduate unit is to enable Registered Nurses to acquire advanced clinical assessment skills based on a comprehensive understanding of the pathophysiology of illness and injury common to the acutely unwell patient across the lifespan in the emergency setting. Knowledge:

Unit Content:

Topics may include:

- Understanding advanced pathophysiology of acute conditions in the context of the emergency patient.
- Advanced systematic assessment of the acutely unwell patient.
- Application of advanced monitoring and diagnostics in the care of the acutely unwell patient
