## Description of the Course :

This course provides students with an opportunity to engage in the field of sport management and understand the broad scope of practice within the industry. This course has an emphasis on the exploration and development of career pathways, and the development of skills and experiences for future employment. A focus of this course is the integration and application of the sport management curriculum within a work context. Students are required to plan and organise professional practice placements and are later responsible for the subsequent completion of these hours within an appropriate sport management setting.

- Value the importance of successfully undertaking the employment application process, which involves a significant time commitment with sufficient attention detail and professional standards.
