Description of the Unit:

This is the first unit in a three-part Honours Project unit chain. Within this unit, students work in a small, selfdirected group towards completion of a research or practice-based project relevant to a contemporary occupational therapy practice issue. This unit aims to consolidate students' skills in evidence-based practice, including the ability to formulate effective questions, conduct effective literature searches, critically appraise research and determine the applicability of identified research to occupational therapy practice. Students will be provided with a practice scenario to develop a proposal for research or a practice-based project in a specific area of occupational therapy.
