Description of the Unit:

This unit consolidates the learning outcomes across the Bachelor of Nursing course. It provides an opportunity to develop confidence and competence in achieving the NMBA Registered Nurse Practice Standards while transitioning from student to Registered Nurse. In consultation with the relevant Unit Coordinator and/or Clinical Coordinator, students will be provided with an opportunity to identify their own learning needs and to seek opportunities to address them within diverse clinical settings. Students will consolidate their knowledge by successfully completing 200 hours of clinical placement. Students will apply the clinical reasoning cycle framework across diverse settings to ensure safe, quality, person-centred care within a global context with consideration of the National Safety, Quality Health Service Standards, Aged Care Quality Standards and Paediatric Quality Standards.

Learning Task and Assessment:

Planned Student Learning Experience

A 30-credit point unit will involve a minimum of 300 hours of learning including clinical placements. For every one hour of teacher -directed learning there will be a minimum of two hours of student/learner directed learning. The *teacher-directed* hours of student learning in this unit will be experienced primarily through teaching innovations like interactive technology enhanced learning, class discussions, audio-visual presentations, flexible blended and on-line learning, low and high fidelity simulations, exploration of case studies and inquiry-based learning. You are expected to attend all scheduled classes and actively participate during class sessions. Attendance at all residential intensives (flexible students), clinical placement and laboratory sessions is compulsory.



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Learner-directed hours will include focused learning activities, simulated laboratory learning, practice and reflection on practice, and role modelling. Students are expected to access electronic research databases and use computers to facilitate learning
