Unit Content:

Topics may include:

- Technical, methodological and ethical principles in the use and interpretation of psychological tests and test scores
- Issues of measurement: norms, reliability, validity, and item analysis
- Administration, scoring, interpretation, profile analysis of an adult intelligence test
- Psychoeducational and behavioural assessment of children and families
- Administration, scoring, interpretation, profile analysis of child assessment scales
- Observational methods
- Assessment of personality in adults
- Writing integrated clinical assessment reports

Learning Task and Assessment:

Students are required to receive a minimum pass grade of 50% for every assessment task. Should a student not achieve this standard on an assessment task, they will receive feedback and have the opportunity to resubmit the assessment task. They will be able to gain no higher than a Pass for the resubmission.
