## **Unit Content:**

The unit will involve 150 hours of practicum activities in pre-placement skills development workshops and supervised practicum experience in FedUni Community Psychology Services or an approved external agency. The unit includes the following aspects:

- Completion of professional practice hours
- Review of accurate log book recording of practicum experiences consistent with registration requirements
- Instruction in the development and recording of professional development plans consistent with registration requirements
- Instruction in the development of a supervision plan over the internship year including accurate log book recording
- Integrating assessment and treatment plans into a detailed formulation and treatment approach
- Instruction on documentation of case notes
- Interpersonal communication with differing client groups and other professionals
