This course enables students to develop an understanding of the nature and function of accounting, perform basic accounting processes and develop skill in using accounting information in business decision making.

Topics may include:

- An introduction to the nature and function of accounting
- Forms of business organisation and structure
- Transaction analysis and financial reports; recognising, measuring, recording and reporting accounting events

- Analysis of financial reports; profitability, liquidity and long-term solvency
- Accounting events and management decision making; cost-volume-profit analysis, budgeting, capital investment decision making using net present value techniques and business financing
