Description of the Course:

This Printmaking course deals with intermediate level aspects of the medium of printmaking in its theoretical and practical aspects, and in its traditional and contemporary applications. The course focusses on teaching students techniques and conventions of printmaking and developing students' own creative and professional skills through access to processes and equipment specific to the medium. To this effect, students enrolled in this course will have the opportunity to participate in workshops as well as engage in individual demonstrations designed to acquaint the students with basic methods, studio procedures and concepts of interest to the medium.

Course Content:

Workshops and individual demonstrations are designed to extend the understanding of printmaking mediums and the correlation between the concept and the finished work, while revising, refining and expanding the basic printmaking processes and skills of the preceding course.

A series of set practical projects related to the mediums being investigated will be undertaken in this course. Students enrolled in this Printmaking course will acquaint themselves with advanced aspects of the medium of printmaking, on both a theoretical and practical level in the fine arts discourse. Students will develop knowledge of both the traditional and contemporary applications of printmaking. The course focusses on teaching students techniques, materials, and studio applications of professional printmaking and on developing students' own creative skills through access to processes and equipment specific to the medium. To this effect, students enrolled in this course will have the opportunity to participate in workshops as well as engage in individual demonstrations designed to acquaint the students with basic methods, studio procedures and concepts of interest to the medium, including engraving, etching, intaglio, relief, lithography, photogravure, and other techniques.
