#### **Objectives:**

After successfully completing this course, students should be able to:

## Knowledge:

- Understand how outdoor experiences can enhance learning foci of Victorian secondary school curriculum
- Describe the aims and rationale for base camping and outdoor activities
- Understand the theoretical perspectives of experiential learning and programming
- Begin to understand the difference between outdoor recreation and outdoor education
- Begin to understand the limitations of outdoor recreation knowledge, skills and values in the teaching of outdoor education
- Understand the procedure to use when planning an outdoor experience
- Recognise the importance of a Risk Management Plan, Emergency Response Plan, Trauma Management and Search and Rescue considerations in both the planning stages and during an outdoor experience
- Understand the importance of careful venue planning
- Understand the general principles of equipment choice and care
- Develop understanding of leadership, decision-making, and conflict resolution strategies
- Understand the importance of good nutrition and hygiene management during an outdoor experience
- Understand key principles of minimal impact camping
- Recognise the importance of developing outdoor experiences with a sustainability focus
- Evaluate the organisation, implementation and impact of an outdoor experience



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## Skills:

- Demonstrate effective use of base camping skills in practical settings
- Develop and apply leadership and organisational skills
- Improve personal skills in an outdoor recreation setting
- Develop skills in programming and implementing a range of base camp games and activities
- Develop skills for staying comfortable in adverse conditions
- Develop an outdoor program with appropriate goals and objectives relevant to specific age groups and curriculum
- Apply other theoretical knowledge as required during an outdoor experience
- Develop an ability to conduct base camping programs causing minimal damage to the surroundings
- Be able to respond appropriately to emergency situations

#### Values:

- Develop an appreciation of the outdoor environment
- Appreciate the need for, and benefits of, cooperation in outdoor settings
- Recognise the value of critical adventure-based learning concepts and practices
- Appreciate the benefits that can be gained from base camping and outdoor activities
- Appreciate the risks associated with outdoor settings and activities
- Recognise the fragility of natural environments and human impact on these environments
- Recognise the detail required for the planning, organisation and execution of a base camp

- Planning and organising a base camp and outdoor activities

- Use and care of outdoor equipment
- Experiential learning theory
- Responsibilities of individual & group
- Navigation / map reading
- Environmental issues
