Handbook Summary:

The Master of Nursing (Coursework) offers an alternative strand to a research project for students who wish to study a special area of professional nursing or health care. A wide range of topics related to theoretical aspects of nursing, education, health care policy and professional nursing issues lend themselves to in-depth study. Alternatively some students may wish to undertake a practicum or travel off-shore to gain experience of another health care system. This course provides opportunities for nurses to explore ideas that will enable them to bring a new perspective to their practice. The special project will not contain any of the primary elements of research, such as participant recruitment, interviews/surveys or data collection, and there will be no coercion, observation, deception, special relationships issues. As a course designed to explore concepts, ideas, policies and/or issues within a theoretical context, the course does not require students to obtain ethical approval and to conduct research. Students who do not wish to undertake research at this stage of their education, may find the Advanced Nursing Project (HCNUR7011) is a viable alternative course to HCNUR7001. The topic for study will have been identified during work throughout courses in the Graduate Studies Program (HCNUR6001, HCNUR6011, HCNUR6021 and an Elective), and will be negotiated with the Program co-ordinator.
